Attention San Xavier District Enrolled Members!

The San Xavier Road Cemetery will be closing soon; there are approximately 40 plots available. Please bring proof of enrollment for all individuals you are applying for and see the guidelines below.

The Hasan Cemetery is open and we are accepting applications for plot reservations.

- ⇒ Plot must be reserved for a SXD community member/SXD Enrolled Member Resolution No.s SXDC 08-08-13 and SXDC 06-09-09,.
- \Rightarrow One (1) Burial Plot Reservation Request Form per individual.
- \Rightarrow Requestor (individual completing the form) is limited to completing 5 forms for their family members.
- \Rightarrow Each plot is 4 feet x 8 feet; 3 feet between each plot. This includes cremains.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Identify (pictures or written description) the plot you wish to reserve.
- \Rightarrow Plot reservations will be completed on a first come, first serve basis.
- ⇒ Provide a current contact phone number. This will allow staff to schedule a meeting with the applicant.



Tohono O'odham Nation's General Welfare Law Application

As a result of the Tohono O'odham Nation's General Welfare Law, Resolution No. 11-553; the District will require all applicants seeking financial assistance to complete the General Welfare Law Application (GWLA). The applicant must complete these forms for all assistance requests, i.e. Educational (books, tuition, bus passes), travel, financial, burial assistance, home repairs, new homes, community per diem travel, etc. This will NOT hold up your request for assistance. The GWLA is a tool to determining whether the applicants request for assistance is considered taxable income or not.

Animal Control:







PREPARE YOUR FEDERAL AND ARIZONA STATE TAX RETURNS FOR "FREE" SAVE \$

The Finance Department has purchased a computer tax preparation program for use by (all District Community Members, the Tohono O'odham Police and Fire Department employees and the Districts employees) that is loaded onto computers in the Finance Department and the Education Center for your use.

Most people will not be able to prepare their taxes until the end of February because employers have until January 31 to distribute W-2 forms and until February 15 to distribute 1099 forms.

District employees in the Finance Department and the Education Center will help you get started using the program and assist you with questions if you get stuck, however the District nor any of the employees that assist you will be responsible for your tax return and you will be asked to sign a waiver of release of the District and it's employees.

Call the Education Department at 807-8620 to reserve a time to use the computers or the Finance Department at 573-4021 or 4023.

IF YOU TAKE THE **STANDARD DEDUCTION** IN PREPARATION OF YOUR TAXES YOU WILL NEED TO BRING THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

W-2 forms from all employers that you worked for during the year.

1099 forms for other income received, etc.

Dates of birth and social security numbers for all dependents that you wish to claim on your tax return.

If you wish to itemize your deductions instead of using the standard deduction call Harold (Skip) Stuth at 573-4024 for a list of items that you will need.

Note: It is always helpful to bring your last years tax returns to compare with this year's!

Note: If while you are using this program it says that you are eligible for the "Earned Income Credit" or the "Child Care Credit" please continue and/or ask for assistance as these credits could mean thousands of dollars in refunds to you!!!!!!!!

Note: It will be helpful for you to bring a "thumb drive" or disk to save your tax information on if you cannot complete the return in one session and/or you want to preserve it electronically.

Men's Talking Circle and Support Group O'odham Ap'edag Ki

We are a small group and are looking to grow bigger. The men who participate find a safe, respectful place to express themselves. What is said in the circle stays within the circle. In all traditional cultures, men have had a place to meet and talk among themselves. It's called brotherhood.

We believe a man can be strong and also caring, open, and loving. We can also laugh and joke with each other. We express our own experience, strength and hope. We want to be able to be good examples to our young men, to lead them on the right path.

Any man from 18 to 100 can come to this group and be respected and equal with the other men. We do not judge. We can ask for help with anything. It is facilitated by Jim Funmaker and William "Bru" Brubaker, but that doesn't mean we are bosses of the group. The group belongs to everyone.

This is a talking circle We express ourselves so that we can grow in a spiritual direction. Besides having the talking circle, we will be expressing ourselves in other ways-engaging in personal growth activities that focus on our concerns, hopes and wishes. We invite any man who is willing to try us out to come at least once and check us out. We meet Tuesday evenings from 5:30 to 6:30 every week at the People Wellness House.

A New Group for Teens and Pre-teens

At the Wellness House, we have support groups for adults and kids, but not for teens and pre-teens. That is about to change.

In place of the old "Standing Strong" groups, we are starting a group for boys and girls together called "White Bison." The White Bison has been sacred to Native Americans for centuries. In 1988, a movement started among many Native tribes that was known as the Red Road to Wellbriety. It is a journey of hope and healing for Native Americans who want to overcome addictions and other problems. O'odham Ap'edag Ki: (People Wellness House) is starting a White Bison group for youth ages 11-17, starting on March 10th and meeting every Sunday from 10-11:30am in the District Center.

We will be showing videos and following the White Bison program. White Bison was inspired by Alcoholics Anonymous and other 12 step programs. There will be plenty of opportunity for discussion and expressing ourselves. The group will be facilitated by Jim Funmaker with some assistance from other People Wellness House staff. We hope that parents and relatives will send their children to our group and that it can become a source of strength for our youth. Approximately half of the US students are impacted by traditional bullying each school day. It happens on buses, in the cafeteria, gym, hallways, playground, and in classrooms. The most frequent form bullying takes is words (teasing, taunting, ridiculing, name-calling, and gossip. Not blows) This type of bullying happens in the 'physical; world and that world has time and space limits. Cyber-bullying is making school days even more painful for many children and some school staff. Bullying in cyberspace is not bound by school hours, school days, or facing the intended bully victim. Unfortunately, the perceived anonymous nature of the internet often insulates the bully from the consequences of their damaging behavior.

As the number of house holds with Internet access approaches saturation and cell phone ownership expands to the 100 million mark, so do the ways kids bully each other. Cyberbullying in the form of text messages, emails, photos, website postings can go school wide in minutes and global in days. Slanderous information sent out into cyberspace is difficult, if not impossible, to expunge. Cyber bullying often takes the form of cyber gossip, where damaging content is based on whim.; not facts and is posted on social networking sites such as MySpace and Facebook.

Cyber Bullying Getting Bigger: Studies indicate that cyber bullying incidents have guadrupled in five years. A 2000 survey by the Crimes against Children Research center at the University of New Hampshire reported 6% of young people had experienced some form of cyber bullying. In 2005, studies of 1500 Internet using adolescents found that over one third had been cyber bullied and half of those admitted to cyber bullying other. A 2005 study by NationalChildrens Home Charity revealed that 20% had been cyber bullied victims. A 2004 survey conducted by I Safe America of 1556 adolescents found that 42% had been bullied online

How Cyber Bullying Messages are Communicated:

Text or digital imaging messages sent on cell phones, emails, instant • messaging, web pages, weblogs (blogs) chattooms or discussion groups, and other information communication technologies

Cyber bullying Perpetrators It Is A cycle:

- Middle School and High School girls were about twice as likely as boys to • display cyberbullying behaviors in the form of email, text, and chat
- Middle School and High School girls were twice as likely as boys to report receiving email, text messages or chat room messages that teased, taunted, and ridiculed.
- 62% said that they had been cyber bullying by another student at school, and 46% had been cyber bullied by a friend
- 55% didn't know who had cyberbullied them •

Only 20% cyber bullying victims tell their parents about the incident. Victims are most likely to a friend (42%)

Ten Tips: Parents Cyber-Bullying Preemption

- 1 Consider Installing filtering and blocking software, but understand clearly that proactive parents are the only real deterrent and the best resource for bullying preemption.
- 2. Keep your home computer(s) in easily viewable places, such as a family room or kitchen.
- 3. Model the behavior you want to see in your child
- 4. Talk regularly with your child about on line activities he or she is involved in about on line activities he or she is involved in 5.
 - Set firm guidelines for cell phone use and monitor that behavior.
- 6. Talk specifically about cyber-bullying. Explain that it is harmful and unacceptable behavior.
- 7. Outline your expectations for responsible online behavior and clearly explain the consequences for inappropriate behavior. Use the Cyber Positive Character Contract from the Cameron site.
- 8. Encourage your child to tell you immediately if he or she is a victim of cyber-bullying. Tell your child does not respond to the bully.
- 9. Stay calm. Plan in advance how you will calmly receive the new that your child is being bullied and the solution steps you will take. You will want the evidence. Tell your child to dace the bullying messages or photo.
- 10. Call your child's school; ask the principal what measurable, bullying preemption, activity based programs they have in place today. Offer to serve on the group that expands the schools behavior policy to include cyber bullying behavior that disrupts the schools teaching and learning environment. Ask about results

Parents, monitor your student's grades so you will know if s/he will need to attend **high school summer school**. Have your student check in with their counselor or Native American Advisor for a progress report.


Students, remember that you need a grade point average of C in order to qualify for the **SXD Summer Youth Work Program** otherwise you will need to attend summer school.
