



WA:K COMMUNITY PARK:

The Planning Department is pleased to provide major updates on the Wa:k Community Park Project. Fencing has been completed around the perimeter of our park, and community members will notice that the park area itself has been cleared up entirely, ready to move into structural development in a short amount of time. Contractors have been advised to keep dust levels at a minimum throughout construction. Additionally, a large deposit of trash near the back end of the park has been collected and removed from the premises. We will continue to ensure that the project is conducted with high standards of care directed at the design and construction of our park. It is the goal of our department to execute the vision of the San Xavier District community.



BROADBAND PROJECT:

Our department also recognizes the importance of internet access and providing this community with adequate Broadband services. The community can expect the installation of three 50' wireless poles, three concrete pads, 21 wireless eNodeB (ENB) radio unit base stations, three wireless communication cabinets (electronics & power storage), three 5x5 fencing enclosures, three 25' electrical meter poles (including secondary connections). Progress on this endeavor is ongoing, and the Planning Department continues to monitor the instillation of fiber optics on I-19, San Xavier Road, and off ramps. Work will begin on this significant Broadband project in the months and weeks to come.



Greetings, Wa:k Community! We hope that you were able to get outdoors or go to some place cool to enjoy this Labor Day Holiday with your family and/or friends. If not, don't feel bad, sometimes just having a 3-day weekend is good enough to spend time at home to rest & relax. The NRD is looking forward to the upcoming Autumn season as we wrap up our fiscal year 2025 budget and prepare for the upcoming CAP supply valve maintenance work that is scheduled to take place 9/15/25-9/18/25, which will have no operational impact on water deliveries. This supply valve maintenance work is different from the annual CAP outage maintenance scheduled for October (we will provide those dates in the following newsletter).

Staff have also been involved with the following meetings or activities: Provided an update to the SX Culture/Natural Resources Committee on ancestral matters and on the Romero Site signage project. Discussions were held regarding future land conservation management with South32, the Four Southern Tribes Working Group, & WestLand Resources representatives. We accompanied the TON Water Resources Dept. to collect a water sample from the Chico Well. The FY 2026 Budget presentation was provided at the community meeting on August 16th. One staff member attended the Mastering Leadership Fundamentals workshop, and office staff attended Confidentiality Training provided by SX HR. Finally, arrangements were made for the SX Culture/Natural Resources Committee to attend the quarterly Copper World Project update meeting.

Groundskeepers/Hikdan: The Groundskeepers continue with their weekly vegetation maintenance duties at the Hikdan; their primary focus is to collect wood materials to mulch for use at a few project home sites within the community. Their assistance was also utilized for cleaning around the District complex, as well as assisting the Natural Resources Specialist in removing Red Algae at the Ha:san Charco. We also had one family utilize the Hikdan for a family function, and the EcoTruths for Indigenous Youth group continued to work on a vegetation research assignment requested by the SX District Council.

Also, it is worth mentioning that those who are acquainted with Mr. Peter Steere (TON THPO), he has officially retired from the TON Cultural Affairs Office. It truly was an honor to have Peter share his knowledge and experience with many of our certified Monitors. It was always interesting to hear some of the archaeological & historical facts about San Xavier. He once said, "That San Xavier is one big archaeological site." He would always highly recommend a Monitor from San Xavier be on site at any of the construction projects that took place in the Tucson area. Peter didn't come around often, but when he did, you made the most out of your time with him because of his busy schedule. We wish him & his wife well and Happy Retirement, Peter!



Calls: Calls may be made between 7am & 9am. Transportation calls after 9am will not be accepted



Transportation will not be provided if the scheduled pick up time for student has not passed according to school bus and Van Tran schedules.


Missed bus transportation WILL NOT be provided for students who are suspended from riding the bus.
