

Once again, it's that time for the upcoming CAP Fall Outage taking place October 20th-November 23rd, 2025. This does affect both the Wa:k Hikdan and Site II temporarily, as both sites will be without water. During this outage, some of the work taking place will include carrying out preventative maintenance and inspections on several pumping plant power systems, along with an electromagnetic inspection of a pumping plant discharge line in the Tucson area. We do apologize for the inconvenience this may cause.

The Natural Resources staff have attended or been involved with the following activities: meetings held with Asarco/UKLA re: livestock issues, assisted with the transplanting of culturally sensitive cacti at Lot #12, planned for the upcoming EcoTruths for Indigenous Youth fall sessions, staff attended the Water Resources Committee Meeting held at the SXAA Offices on 9/3, and we assisted with the SXD Culture/Natural Resources Committee's request for certain ceremonial items and traffic control for the Reburial Ceremony.

LAND ASSIGNMENT POLICY


If you received a tribal land assignment more than one(1) year ago and have not yet utilized the assigned land, please reach out to SXD Housing Department to discuss your next steps and available options. Due to shortage of tribal land, the Housing Department will follow the procedures outlined in the Land Assignment Policy to revoke land assignments if construction has not begun within one year of the assignment. If you need an extension, please contact the Housing Department

Land Assignment Policy: 3.0 – GENERAL PROVISION 3.3 – EXISTING SXD LAND ASSIGNMENTS SITES:

3.3.2 – Any existing, non-utilizing SXD Land Assignment Site that has been assigned for ONE year on or after the effective date of this policy shall be revoked and returned to the status of available tribal land. To avoid revocation, the assignee shall, within ninety days of written notification by the District, utilize the SXD Land Assignment Site by starting construction of any dwelling. If this is not possible, they may request an extension of their assignment through the SXD Housing Department.

3.4.8 – A SXD Land Assignment Site shall be utilized by the assignee within one year from the date of the approved SXDC Resolution by constructing a home or placing a dwelling on the SXD Land Assignment Site. If one year has passed, the applicant can request an extension through the Housing Manager via an official letter and be considered for a six-month extension, or otherwise withdraw land assignment, or the land assignment will revert back to SXD if no action has been taken.

Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act

The SAWRSA Office consists of Margaret (Maggie) Alvarez and Velma Begay. This article covers a little bit of history and our responsibilities.

The Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act (SAWRSA) was signed by President Ronald Reagan in October 1982. Water users (agribusiness owners, copper mines, and city of Tucson) were held accountable for draining groundwater from under the San Xavier District.

SAWRSA secured water rights and required the government to build water facilities, fund irrigation systems and create water management plans. Through Central Arizona Project (CAP), a pipeline was installed to deliver Colorado River water from Lake Mead, approximately 336 miles.

The Tohono O'odham Nation (Nation) was allocated 66,000 acre feet per year (one acre feet = one foot deep of water on one acre). From the Nation's allocation, San Xavier District has 35,000 acre feet of first right of beneficial use of CAP water. The Schuk Toak District was granted 16,000 acre feet per year.

The 1982 Act was Amended in 2004, entitled the Arizona Water Settlement Act. The Amendment further supported the community's water right claims that also includes restoring and stabilize groundwater, restore riparian habitat, and working capital for the San Xavier Cooperative Association farm.

The SAWRSA Office was created in 1999 with the purpose of working with a multi-agency team to rehabilitate the existing farm and construct an extension. The multi-agency team consists of the San Xavier Cooperative Association, San Xavier Allottee Association, Bureau of Reclamation, Tohono O'odham Nation, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and other agencies.

Next month, we will explain authorizations and start listing projects that were completed because of the 1982 Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act/2004 Arizona Water Settlement Act.



We are now accepting applications for both sessions which will then be placed on a waiting list. As we start our program Staff have been engaged in the following.

August 11-14, 2025, People Wellness Staff had the opportunity to attend the 57th Annual Southwestern School for Behavioral Studies in Chandler Az. This focused on various sessions of mental health i.e., youth crisis, substance abuse & treatment, healing attachments, ADHD, Technology effects on children & parents and many more. These sessions were very informative.

On August 26, 2025, PWH planned a Family Taco Tuesday evening with a presentation for parents/guardians and students by the Tohono O'odham Nation's Special Needs Program, this was very informative for all in attendance. Students were made aware of some of the difficulties their peers may have and were encouraged to assist these students when they need a little help.

In moving forward, I plan to continue to introduce the O'odham Himdag/language, schedule field trips within the community & surrounding areas, engage students' creativity through art, have mindfulness and individual sessions which focus on the well-being of the students, schedule school visits on a regular basis and engage parents in activities i.e. parent nights, presentations and having them join their child/ren in activities planned for the holidays & other events. As always "It is the students that bring the joy, laughter within our building and we the staff are learning from our students as well".







Calls: Calls may be made between 7am & 9am. Transportation calls after 9am will not be accepted


